## **BACKGROUND:**

The Port Commission will host a Policy Roundtable discussion on industrial business growth in the Kent-Auburn Valley on Thursday, February 14, 1 p.m. in the Auburn City Council Chambers.

The Policy Roundtable will touch on the goals and needs of warehouses/distribution centers and manufacturing in the Kent-Auburn Valley, including issues such as industrial land policy, transportation and other infrastructure needs and funding, incentives for business expansion, obstacles to growth, future business projections, competitiveness, and government policies that foster or discourage growth.

The topic of industrial growth is closely connected to the Port's Century Agenda vision of adding 100,000 Port-related jobs to the region in the next 25 years.
