- Flight Corridor Safety Program

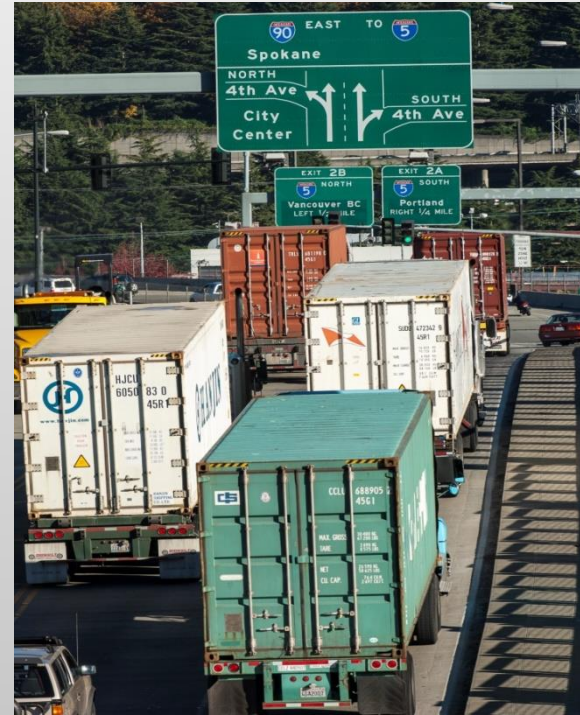
