Top Priorities - Aviation

- Advocate for a long-term FAA Reauthorization bill that includes robust Airport Improvement Program (AIP) funding.
- Provide leadership on efforts to give the Commission the authority to set the Passenger Facility Charge user fee.
- Work to alleviate passenger wait times.
- Increase FAA notification to the Port and the community related to flight path changes; engage federal stakeholders related to community noise and environmental impacts.
- Coordinate with federal agencies on state-level advocacy efforts on REAL ID regulations.



Invest in our Airport and Address Community Impacts

Top Priorities - Maritime



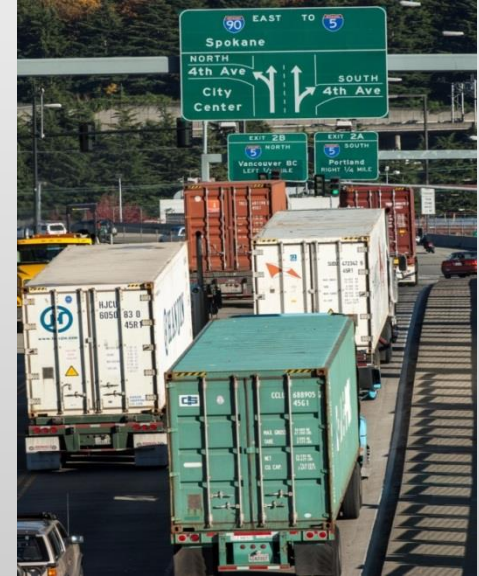
- Reform the HMT to provide greater equity and competitiveness for donor ports.
- Achieve \$50 million appropriation for the “donor port” rebate program created in WRRDA Section 2106.
- Reform NOAA’s Fisheries Finance Program to better support construction and reconstruction of fishing vessels.
- Advocate for appropriations to complete the T-18, T-30 and T-5 deepening feasibility study, and for design and construction.
- Engage on implementation and funding for a national multimodal freight strategy and related grants.
- Work toward expedited deployment by Customs and Border Patrol of radiation portal monitors and adequate staffing levels to ensure efficient movement of cargo.
