Ground Transportation Access Plan (GTAP)

2019 Resolution Goals

By 2030, achieve

- 50% reduction in Scope
 3 greenhouse gas (GHG)
 emissions
- 30% passengers use private vehicle pick-up/drop-off
- 15 minutes tower to curb/garage

Additional Commission Priorities

- Increase passenger/employee use of high occupancy (HOV) modes
- Minimize private vehicle demand for curbside loading and unloading
- Ensure equitable outcomes

Recent Accomplishments

Incentivize Clean Vehicle Technologies

- Environmental standards and incentives for Transportation Network Companies (TNCs) and taxis
- Using renewable natural gas in Port bus fleet
- Provided Electric Vehicle (EV) chargers in cell phone lot

Promote Low-Carbon Modes

Completed access fee legal analysis

Support Sustainable Commuting

 Developing airport-wide Transportation Management Association (TMA)



Proposed Pathway to Meet 2030 GHG Goal

Incentivize Clean Vehicle Technologies
Support zero emission vehicles (ZEVs) and renewable fuels for Ground Transportation (GT) providers

Promote Low-Carbon Modes
Change passenger behavior

Support Sustainable Commuting
Port and tenants meet commute trip
reduction (CTR) goal

Low Carbon Modes	Mode Share	
	Current	2030
Transit	6%	10%
Airporters, etc.	14%	16%
TNCs and taxis	12%	25%
Long-term parking	13%	15%

Key Items in Near-Term Work Plan (2022)

Incentivize Clean Vehicle Technologies

- Convene stakeholder process with GT service providers and government agencies to understand vehicle/charging needs and financial barriers
- Recommend policies and partnerships to support transition to clean vehicles

Promote Low-Carbon Modes

- Complete access fee/mode choice and traffic modeling for impacts on roadways and facilities
- Complete pilot for transit tickets, continue east-side outreach, and develop transit strategy

Support Sustainable Commuting

• Implement airport-wide transportation management association (TMA)

Long-Term (2024-2030)

Incentivize Clean Vehicle Technologies

Implement GT service provider strategy


Promote Low-Carbon Modes
