Port Major Changes - Preamble, Article II-III:

- Expanded Preamble (Preamble)
- Commission duties and responsibilities enumerated (Art. II)
- Additional procedures to fill a vacancy (Article III, Section 4)
- More detail on committee structure and functioning (Article III, Section 6)
- New clause on Port-related board memberships (Article III, Section 7)

Port SealVlajor Changes - Article V:

- Work sessions eliminated (Art. V)
- Time/Date of Meetings:
 1 p.m. on the 1st, 2nd and 4th Tuesdays (Art. V, Section 1)
- Four meetings annually outside the Port (Art. V, Section 4)

of Seattle | Major Changes - Article V:

- Transparency Code of Conduct incorporated into Bylaws (Art. V, Section 6)
- Executive sessions limited to two per month (Art. V, Section 6(B)
- Provision for meeting in absence of a quorum (Art. V, Section 7)

of Seattle Major Changes - Article VI-IX:

- Order of Business simplified and made more flexible (Art. VI)
- Motions and Resolutions must be seconded (Art. VII, Section 2, Art. VIII, Section 2)
- Subjects raised for discussion under New Business do not require a second (Art. VII, Section 2)
