### **Original 2010 Estimates**

- Qualifying Vessel Visits: 350
  Participating Carriers

  8 container carriers
  3 cruise lines
- Incentives to be paid: \$787,500

# ABC Program Results of Seattle Through 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2010

- 7 container lines
- 4 Cruise lines
- 322 visits
- Incentive payouts \$724,500 (\$2250 per visit)

#### Port Program Expenses Through of Seattle Q3 2010

- Approved 2010 budget:
- Increase Approved 6/2010

- Payouts 1-3<sup>rd</sup> Quarters
- Amount remaining in Puget Sound Clean Air Agency Budget

#### Port Q4 2010 Program Expenses of Seattle

- Projected Q4 visits: 101
- Project payout for Q4 : \$227,250
- Current program budget amount remaining: \$120,000
- Gap in funding for Q4: \$110,250
- Projected total incentive funding: \$951,750



#### **Reasons for Shortfall**

- June 2010 increase request was based on 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter numbers
- The program has been much more successful than anticipated
