





#### Port Jobs

- In 1993, the Port of Seattle spearheaded the creation of Port Jobs, a 501c3 nonprofit organization, to provide a forum for stakeholders to work together on workforce issues in Port-related business sectors.
- Today: Port Jobs has served more than 78,400 people, helping fill more than 12,300 job openings with airport employers and in the skilled trades.
- In 2011, Port Jobs expanded work into the transportation and logistics sector, doing outreach to Port-related drayage truck drivers, and teaching a new Customer Service class targeted to rental car facility applicants.



# Port Jobs Services

- 8,773 job seekers assisted and 682 open positions filled at Sea-Tac Airport. (Airport Jobs)
- 41 airport workers completed 69 credit-bearing college classes onsite at the airport. 149 people completed job skills classes. (Airport University)
- 85 people placed in apprenticeships and tradesrelated jobs earning an average of \$18.54 per hour plus benefits. (Apprenticeship Opportunities Project)



### 2011 Trends


As the local economy began to stabilize:

- Airport Jobs placements began to rise after a three-year drop.
- The number of job seekers visiting Airport Jobs leveled off after increasing over the past several years.
- AOP's placements rose for the second year in a row.


Airport Jobs Hires



Number of Job Seekers





#### Wrap-around Services

- Financial Tools for the Trades: Port Jobs taught 13 Financial Tools classes to 183 apprentices and pre-apprentices in 2011. We partnered with American Financial Solutions, a non-profit credit counseling agency, to offer free onsite credit counseling after classes, and with the Dept. of Veteran's Affairs to co-teach classes to veterans.
- Free Tax Prep: In partnership with United Way, volunteers prepared 337 tax returns for airport workers and residents, bringing \$578,000 in Federal tax refunds back into the community. The average adjusted gross income of filers was \$29,230.
- **Basic Food Employment & Training:** In partnership with the state Department of Social & Health Services, 74 people receiving Basic Food services secured jobs at the airport.
