Port Human Trafficking Strategy

In January 2018, Commission passed a motion committing staff to finalizing and implementing a Port-wide strategy to combat human trafficking with four main focus areas:

Internal Policies and Procedures Eliminate/Reduce Human Anti-**Public Awareness and Education Trafficking** Conducive Human **Trafficking Conditions within Employee Awareness & Training Strategy Port Facilities: Long Term Enduring Program Community Partnership**


