

- New seating with electrical power at Concourse A gate holdrooms
- New seating <u>without</u> new electrical power at:
 - The Club at SEA passenger lounge in the South Satellite (electrical charging for some but not all seats re-using existing electrical circuits)
 - The west end relaxation area of the South Satellite
 - Security checkpoint recomposure areas

Not in Project Scope


• Replacement of seating at Concourse D and South Satellite gate holdrooms is not in the project scope. Work in those areas will be completed by future projects after new electrical infrastructure is constructed to provide the necessary electrical capacity.

- Refresh aesthetic of airport




Project will provide seating that meets the needs of passengers with reduced mobility



Existing Seating at Port shared-use lounge (Club at SEA at South Satellite)




Existing Seating at West End Relaxation Area at South Satellite







Seating Location	Type of Seating	Electrical Charging at Seats?
Concourse A Gate Holdrooms	Primarily row seating and a small amount of accent seating	Row seating – yes Accent seating – if possible
Club at SEA at South Satellite	Lounge-style seating	Yes, at some, but not all seats, utilizing existing wall outlets
Relaxation Area at South Satellite West End	Lounge-style seating	No
Security Checkpoints	Bench seating	No
