Dear Port Commissioners,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide Public comment.

In these last two years, we have been working, as a Duwamish Valley Community, very closely with the Port of Seattle and as a result we were able to concretize our work into the document called the Duwamish Valley Community Commitment (CBC) which was approved last December under resolution 3767 of the Port of Seattle. This project has generated and raised great expectations in our Duwamish Valley Community as it addresses three clear objectives that, historically, have been unfairly affected, such as economic development, health and the environment, and a lack of connection between our Community and the Port of Seattle.
